<u>Our Purpose</u>

- To recognize the uniqueness of each child and encourage self-esteem and individuality.
- To provide a strong, developmentally appropriate academic foundation for each child, helping to ensure future success through kindergarten transition and beyond.
- To provide purposeful work times and opportunities for children to ask questions, pursue ideas, get messy and creative, and thrive.
- To encourage each child to be concerned for others, to cooperate in work and play, and to develop a spirit of sharing.
- To provide an environment where Christian values are not just studied, but lived, with teachers showing examples of Christ's way of love, acceptance, and forgiveness.
- To form a partnership with families that encourages growth and success for each child.

THE TODDLER CLASS (Ducklings) Toddlers can attend 2 or 3 days a week for our three-hour class in which a variety of developmentally appropriate learning

activities occur. Structuring the environment and planning activities for self-directed play, social interaction, and learning is a fundamental part of the program as our toddlers learn to interact with trusted adults and peers. Curriculum activities include dramatic play, open-ended creative and sensory experiences (painting, sand and water play, modeling clay, collage activities, etc), construction activities with blocks and manipulative toys, gardening, math, science, and outdoor activities. Different colors, animals, foods, numbers, shapes, and other topics are explored each day with books, art, math, science, and songs. The children get lots of love, attention, and nurturing every day to make sure they feel safe, secure, and happy. Children do not have to be potty trained to join this class.

THE THREE-YEAR OLD CLASS (Penguins) Our 3-day program for 3-year olds meets

for three hours each day, with additional options for extended days after school. Teachers scaffold and facilitate an environment where children learn to label, understand, and verbalize their feelings and needs, as they work together to form positive social relations with their peers and teachers. At three, there is more interactive pretend play and cooperative play amongst children. By the end of the year, playgroups have increased in size with four or five children interacting in the classroom and on the playground with imaginative play. There are both large and small group times, which include songs, stories, finger plays, art, music, math, science, and fun body movement activities where children get a strong introduction to early childhood academics. Learning is enhanced with art projects, activities, experiments, games, and class themes. The children's fine motor skills are strengthened using various mediums and manipulatives, and children are encouraged to express themselves in the writing and art center freely. Each day the children have fun and gain a sense of pride and accomplishment with jobs and roles they choose as important members of their school family.

THE FOUR-YEAR OLD PRE-KINDERGARTEN CLASS (Frogs) Our 4-day Pre-K program includes 2 extended days on M/W, with optional extended days on T/TH. We believe this structure best prepares our students for the longer kindergarten day and gives them valuable opportunities to gain important, kindergarten-needed social skills, such as self-help and confidence, through lunch time and the extended days. All children in this group will be eligible by age for kindergarten the following year. A typical day in this kindergarten-readiness classroom involves developmentally appropriate experiences in all domains: cognitive, social, emotional, physical, and spiritual. This theme and center-based program allows children to utilize materials in more complex and extended ways. Opportunities for public speaking in front of peers are provided. Many of the activities, which include the nationally acclaimed Get Set for School program, promote the children's phonemic awareness and are critical to early reading success. The children practice writing letters and numbers with varying mediums and methods. Early mathematical skills are also developed with graphing, sorting, counting, and basic addition and subtraction. Music and movement are enjoyed daily. Children improve their fine motor skills with activities that include cutting, painting, coloring, writing, and gluing. Scientific topics are presented to the children in fun and interesting, hands-on ways. Problem solving, conflict resolution, labeling and managing emotions, self-help and independence, and other social emotional skills are essential and are practiced and modeled daily.

All of our classes include the following:

- Class Meetings (welcome, story time, music, etc.)
- Small Group Time (art, science, math, writing, reading, etc)
- Outdoor Time (every day the children have large motor skill play in the outdoor play area)
- Bathroom/Handwashing/Snack
- Music/Movement
- Quiet Reading/Rest
- Free Choice (small group activities, interest centers open for learning, free play, creative art activities, math, and science experiences)

Family Chapel Time

Each month we meet with the Pastor and the Family Ministry Coordinator of Esperanza Lutheran Church at Family Chapel Time. **Parents are invited and encouraged to attend Family Chapel services at any time (dates on lesson plans).**

Chapel Time includes a lesson and music.

The purposes of these services include:

- To let each child know they are unique and loved
- To give the children a personal worship experience
- To provide a spiritual unity for our school by singing praises to God
- To know that Jesus is their friend and that we strive to treat others with love and kindness as He taught

Classes, individual students, teachers, pastors and other outside speakers may be a part of the chapel services.

All tuition is based on a yearly amount and is payable in ten installments for August through May.

Tuition payments are due by the 10th of each month. A 15% tuition discount will be applied to a second child enrolled in the same family.

A non-refundable **registration fee of \$225.00** is payable upon enrollment. Consideration for registering two or more children is as follows: Second child is \$175.00 and third child is \$150.00. All fees and tuition payments are non-refundable. **Enrichment Classes and Lunch Bunch (Penguins & Frogs) are offered for an additional fee between the hours of 11:30am – 2:00pm.**

Please read and initial the following statements. If you have questions, please do not initial any item until you have had your question answered by the CoH staff and understand it completely.

I understand that all programs are based on meeting minimum enrollment requirements.

_____I understand that registration fees and tuition are based on an annual rate and cannot be pro-rated or refunded under any circumstance (illness, vacation, holidays, school breaks, etc.)

I understand that tuition is due by the 10th of each month, August – May. Tuition is considered late if received after the 10th and can be assessed a \$15 late fee at that time. Auto pay can be set up through Brightwheel. Returned check fees will be the responsibility of the payor. We also accept debit or credit payment through Brightwheel.

_____ I understand that registration is for the entire school year. In the event I need to withdraw my child, I will provide a 30-day written notice. If I fail to comply with this requirement, I will be charged one month's tuition to cover any monetary loss incurred by the preschool.

_____ I understand that I must maintain updated medical information annually and be current on all immunizations required by the Department of Health.

_____I understand that my child's Lead Teacher will contact me prior to school starting to schedule a Home Visit. This visit allows the teacher to (re) introduce herself with the student in the student's comfortable home setting prior to the first day of school.

_____I understand that children too sick to participate in the full program (indoor and outdoor) must be kept home. I understand my child may return to school when fever and vomit free for 24 hours. Parents are to notify the preschool office of any absences and any contagious disease/illness via Brightwheel or phone (480-759-1515).

_____ I understand the importance of reading all information provided to me by CoH staff in a timely fashion including posts and messages on Brightwheel (Free Communication App), Family Handbook, emails, notes, newsletters, flyers, and Parent Orientation Packet.

_____I agree to attend Parent/Teacher Conference(s).

_____ I understand that my child will be released ONLY to those individuals whose names are listed on the DHS health form and listed as approved pickups on Brightwheel. Release to anyone other than those listed will require arrangements with the Director.

_____ I understand that my child will be released from the program if he/she cannot benefit from the program or presents a danger to self or others as determined by teacher(s) and Director.

_____I understand that monies raised from fundraisers/events throughout the year help supplement and support programs at the school.
